- You can still use your photo ID if it's out of date, as long as it looks like you.
- The name on your ID should be the same name you used to register to vote.

## National Testing of the UK's new Emergency Alerts system

A reminder that on Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> April at 3.00 p.m. there will be a National Testing of the UK's Emergency Alerts system.

Your mobile phone or device might make a loud sound, even if it is set to silent; vibrate; read out a message. This will last for around 10 seconds. There will be a message on your screen saying: "This is a test of Emergency Alerts, a new UK government service that will warn you if there's a life-threatening emergency nearby."

This is part of Parent Pay for those parents who have secondary school children. **We will need all parents to download the app** as this will be our method of payment for School Meals, Breakfast Club, After School Clubs & School Trips.
