#### The Feast of Saint Peter and Saint Paul:


Once again, last Sunday, we celebrated another of the Church's great feast days, the Feast of Saint Peter and Saint Paul. In assemblies today, we have reflected on their importance to us, to our faith and to the formation of the church that we are a part of today.

As leaders of the early Christian community, Peter and Paul were wonderful teachers and witnesses to the Gospel. They instructed people by their words, by their actions and love for God. Today they offer us some essential lessons too and can be our guiding example.

Peter and Paul teach us about humility, imperfection and redemption. Their lives are a clear example of mistakes and wrong choices. Both Peter and Paul had many moments of despair and hitting 'rock bottom'. Peter, the tempestuous apostle, who denied even knowing Jesus and deserted Him in His hour of need. Paul, who had persecuted, arrested and killed the early Christians, wanting to destroy the Church and wipe out the early followers of Christ.

Yet, through faith, humility and acknowledging their errors, they found a new path in life. A path that led them to building the early Church and laying the foundations upon which it is built today. Saint Peter and Paul trusted in God's mercy and love. Having experienced God's forgiveness, they were transformed.

Today, their extraordinary lives teach us about the transformative power of forgiveness that is always offered by God. He is always ready to forgive us. Just like Saint Peter and Saint Paul, we need to believe in this and be willing to accept it.
