On Monday the children wore odd socks to celebrate difference and today have dressed in BLUE clothing to promote peace, tolerance & respect of differences.

Road Safety & Parking: This week has marked a local focus upon road safety awareness. This is a matter that is of such importance & relies upon everyone doing their part to make sure that the road & pavements around St Margaret Mary's are safe for our children, families & residents. Sadly there continue to be some instances of parents leaving cars on the zig-zag lines or blocking residents' driveways. This understandably causes real anger & sadly school often has to mediate, pick-up-the-pieces or face the brunt of this anger, which I believe is unfair. The staggered drop-off & collection times should ease traffic on the road & with this in mind I ask that we please drive & park safely & responsibly.

COVID-19 Symptom Reminder: Again a reminder & plea to make sure that your child does not come into school if they develop **any** of the following: See latest information below taken from NHS/Public Health England

- A high temperature
- A new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot, for more than an hour or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours. [Usually a dry cough & not a productive/mucus-based one]
- A loss or change to sense of smell or taste this means they cannot smell or taste anything or things smell or taste different to normal.
- This also importantly applies to you as a parent or any other member of your household or person[s] your child or family have been in contact with.
- The moment that your child or you develop symptoms, or decide to book a test is the moment we should limit our movement & contacts & not be coming into school. From this school is contacted immediately, to be aware of the impact that this is likely to have on staff & children & make plans.

















These are such worrying & difficult times & I know how hard it is for you & for everyone, but if in doubt please phone school as soon as the above applies & we will calmly support you through the process, providing help. Once again thank-you for all that you are doing to manage & support this.
